#### Whole School Extra Curricular Provision

As part of my role on SLT, last week I had the pleasure of presenting to Year 7,8,9,10 assemblies regarding the importance of extracurricular clubs.

Since September **Toynbee staff have put on 124 different clubs** across all areas of the curriculum and beyond. **70% of the pupils have attended** at least one totalling **over 10,000 visits** 

I quizzed them about their evenings and the majority admitted to spending most of their time looking at a screen scrolling through the same few apps over and over or gaming. I stated that they could still do this if they left school at 4pm-4:30pm having attended a school extracurricular session. Statistically pupils that engage in the school longer than the five one-hour lessons achieve higher GCSE grades than average.

I also spoke about the importance of having these extra activities on their personal statement for college or employment interviews.

This year there have been new clubs such as Lego club and squash club and film club and chess club will be starting after Easter and I am looking into a golf club and also organising an external provider to qualify pupils in First Aid soon.
