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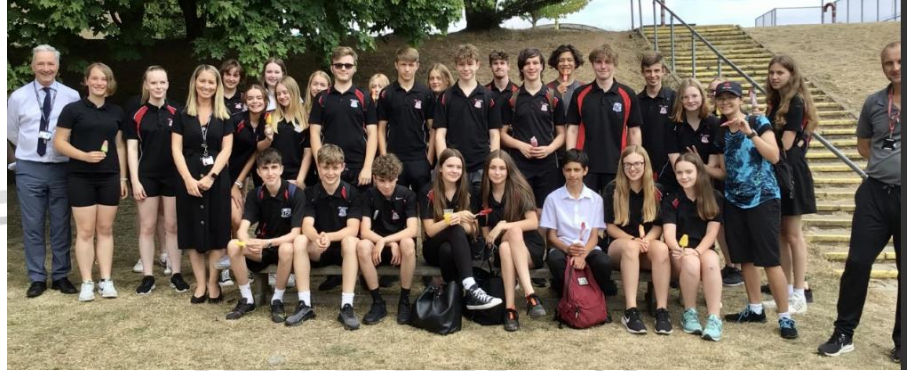

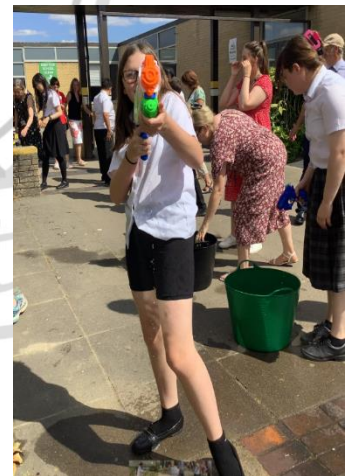

Holiday Activities and Food schemes

The Department for Education funded Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF) provides eligible children with the opportunity to take part in enriching activities and enjoy a hot meal as well as receiving nutritional education and wider health and wellbeing support.

The HAF programme creates the opportunity to keep many vulnerable children engaged in positive activities and in the view of professionals while schools take a well-earned break.

Your school may well be running or hosting a HAF provision. Alternatively, your school may have been approached by one or more providers in your area.

Please do all you can to signpost all of your eligible families, either by:

- distributing HAF providers' flyers, emails or booking codes;
- directing families to the [Family Information and Services Hub \(FISH\)](#), where they can search for schemes in their local area.

Please encourage all families who have booked a HAF scheme to ensure that their child attends. Non-attendance prevents others from benefiting and wastes a healthy and nutritious meal.

HAF eligibility includes:

- school aged children in Year R and above who are in receipt of benefits related free school meals;
- recently arrived Ukrainian and Afghan refugees.

In addition to the main criteria above, providers have the ability to offer up to 15% of their capacity to a wider group of vulnerable children which may include:

- children with SEND or an EHCP plan;
 - children in contact with Early Help or Social Services.
