GCSE Choices Process

This week saw the launch of the GCSE Choices Process for Year 8. This is the stage in their secondary education where they get the opportunity to choose which GCSEs they will study alongside the core curriculum at Key Stage 4.

The process was started on Wednesday with the Key Stage 4 Curriculum Evening. This evening saw the pupils and parents of Year 8 have the process of choosing GCSEs outlined, an explanation of how the Key Stage 4 curriculum is structured, and they received a copy of the GCSE Choices Handbook for Pupils and Parents. This document outlines the process further, but most importantly, has pages dedicated to each subject and what the subject looks like at GCSE. This is a valuable resource that is full of information, and is something that should be referred to over the coming month.

I would like to take this opportunity to say to the pupils and parents of Year 8 just how lovely it was to meet you on Wednesday at this event. It was an incredibly well attended event and was a clear demonstration of just how supported your children are and how you want the very best for them. It was fantastic to have our parents able to attend these kind of events in person, and it was lovely to have such thoughtful conversations with you about the process your children are embarking on.



Next week the process continues with the launch of the GCSE Choices Microsite on the 3rd May (delayed a day by the bank holiday). This site will contain a virtual version of Wednesday night's presentation, an electronic version of the GCSE booklet, and videos from Heads of Department outlining their subjects in even more detail. I hope you find it useful.
