Classroom Discipline Chain

It is the responsibility of everyone to ensure classrooms are respectful places where:

Teachers can teach
Pupils can learn
Everyone feels safe

Teachers will ensure this by employing behaviour management techniques focused on building positive relationships, maximising pupil learning and minimising disruption.

Pupils will ensure this by following the Toynbee Expectations focused on 'Respect':



The steps below indicate teachers' & pupils' actions, should further steps be required

Step I

Teacher issues a verbal warning to the pupil

The teacher will inform the pupil of the infringement, the behaviour that is expected of them and how they can achieve this.

Step 2

Teacher will send the pupil to work in a Buddy Room

The pupil will complete their work in the Buddy Room.

The teacher will meet the pupil after the lesson and arrange a sanction.

Step 3

Pupil refuses to follow the teacher's instructions to go the Buddy Room or pupil disrupts the learning of the Buddy Room

The teacher will contact 'On-Call', who will remove the pupil to another space.

The teacher/HoD will arrange a sanction, parents will be contacted, and a restorative meeting will be arranged.

'On Call' should be called immediately if a pupil:

Uses verbally abusive, sexual or discriminatory language Acts in an unsafe, aggressive or intimidatory way

The incident will be referred to GM, PD or SLT for action


