Dear Parents/Carers

A significant proportion of our teaching staff are NEU members and have indicated that they will be striking. Given the uncertainty of staffing levels for Wednesday 1st February, we will not be able to open the school to all pupils with exception of vulnerable pupils who will be contacted directly. The decision has been taken for health and safety and supervision reasons.

We will ensure that remote learning is in place for all pupils on Wednesday and this will be accessed through Satchel One. There will be no live lessons on this day as this is deemed as covering for striking colleagues, something we are unable to do. The work set will be on the core subjects of English, Maths and Science, and the usual timetable for pupils on this day will be suspended.

I understand that this may cause significant disruption to families, I hope by providing you with advanced notice of arrangements we will be able to minimise the inevitable impact this industrial action will cause.

I would like to thank you in advance for your support and to those of you who have already contacted me with your support. I am sorry that we are not able to open as normal. This is a complex and difficult situation and we have thought very carefully about how to proceed. Ultimately the safety of our pupils remains our priority.

Learning Resource Centre update.

January has been a busy month for the Learning Resource Centre, there has been voting on the Royal Society's Science book awards by our year 9 judging panel, pupils have been updating their reading logs with all of their holiday reading and Sora our digital eBook reading app has gotten off to a flying start. I would like to thank my Year 9 judging panel Jay, Tilda, Naomi, Ethan & Maria, they expended a lot of effort reading and reviewing the shortlisted books, and had some wonderfully insightful comments during our voting meeting. The overall winner from all votes will be announced by the Royal Society in March, and I will update you in due course.

The winner of our £20 Waterstones voucher for logging on to our eBook app over the holidays was Tej in Year 7 - congratulations to him for some excellent digital reading!

On the 1st February we will be launching our Blind Date with a Book promotion in the Learning Resource Centre. Our pupil librarians have been hard at work selecting titles and identifying genres and key words to add to the wrapped books, pupils will then be able to select a wrapped book based on these key words only. We hope that this will encourage pupils to pick a book that they might not otherwise select. There will be a 1 proud point reward for borrowing the book, when they have finished reading the title if they give me a written or verbal review, they will receive a further 5 proud point award. The promotion was incredibly popular last year and the Learning Resource Centre was a very exciting place to be while students opened their selections.

As always please remind pupils to return any overdue books, I will be sending letters home at the end of the month for those books that are in excess of 50 days overdue. At this point we assume they are lost and request the cost of the book be paid, if the pupil still has the book, they can still return it to the Learning Resource Centre with no cost involved.
