The Theoretical Framework

These four headings make up everything you will be asked to study in Media Studies. As you make your revision cards, can you apply these different ideas to your CSPs?

Media Language: Forms of Media Language, Choice of Media Language, Media Theories of Narrative, Technology and Media Products, and Codes and Conventions.

Media Representation: Re-presentation, Theoretical Perspectives on Gender, Choice of Media Producers, Representation of Reality, Stereotypes, Misrepresentation, Viewpoints, Reflections of Context, Audience Interpretations and Social, Political and Cultural Significance.

Media Industries: The Nature of Media Production, Production Processes, Ownership, Convergence, Funding Models, Commercial Industries, Regulation, and Digital Technologies.

Media Audiences: Theoretical Perspectives on Audiences, Range of Audiences, Targeting, Categorisation, Media Technologies, Interpretations, Media Practices, Audience Responses and Social, Cultural and Political Significance.

Questions in this section can test any two of the following forms:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• radio• music video• newspapers• online, social and participatory media and video games• film (industries only).
