Last term four Toynbee teams competed in the South Central qualifying tournament (Hampshire, Dorset, Wiltshire). Our U13 Girls and U13 Boys won their tournaments and the U15 Girls finished 3rd. All three teams qualified for next round.

This week the three teams travelled to Bournemouth for the South Central Regional Championships (Hampshire, Dorset, Wiltshire, Berkshire and Buckinghamshire).



The U15 Girls finished in 6^{th} place.

The U13 Girls played in a six team round robin competition and won four games and lost one and were **crowned Regional Champions.**

The U13 boys won their pool and semi final and lost by one goal in the final.
