Scheme of Learning: Elizabethan Theatre - Shakespeare

Topic Sequence:

Year 7: Summer Term Elizabethan Theatre - Macbeth

Topic Overview:

During this topic students will continue to explore, develop and refine their drama skills through the genre of Elizabethan Theatre. Focusing specifically on William Shakespeare's 'Macbeth'. They will develop their knowledge and understanding of the theatre style, Shakespearean language and performing from a text.

Lesson Sequence:

The lessons have been sequenced to build knowledge and understanding of key drama skills and their application in scripted performances, through the exploration of Shakespeare's 'Macbeth'.

- Voice: vocal pause, pace, rhythm and rhyme, vocal soundscape
- Characterisation: role-play, thought- tracking, subtext
- Staging: shape and form, purpose, advantages and disadvantages of thrust staging, similarities and differences between the staging types studied this year
- Genre and Style: Globe Theatre context/space, the Elizabethan audience, evaluate clips from performances at The Globe and more contemporary-style productions

Interleaved Revision: Physical warm-ups, body language and proxemics, still images, physical tension, movement dynamics, action/reaction, vocal warm-ups, vocal dynamics and projection, vocal tone, script form, role play, rehearsal skills, audience skills, techniques for learning lines and cues, basic analytical skills.

All topics within drama are sequenced in a spiral curriculum where key knowledge, skills and concepts are taught, revisited and developed throughout each topic to refine and secure students' knowledge, skills and application of drama across all Key Stages.
