

CONTEXT:

You will explore what PITCH means in music and how it can be notated (written down) both using graphic scores and traditional stave notation. You will learn treble clef notation (or discover a new clef if you are already an expert in this area!) and make up your own phrase to help you remember the names of the notes. You will find out or consolidate your prior knowledge of what the notes on the keyboard are called and you will learn to play a piece of music on the keyboard, using correct finger positioning and technique. You will also learn what chords are and how they are used to accompany melody. If you already play the keyboard or piano, there will be a range of repertoire to challenge you at a higher level and you will also have the opportunity to develop skills in

VOCABULARY

PITCH – how high or low notes are

GRAPHIC SCORE – symbols showing time and pitch in music

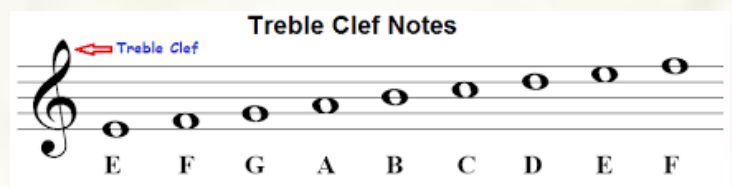
STAVE – lines notes are written on

TREBLE CLEF – the symbol showing music is for a higher instrument or the right hand of the piano

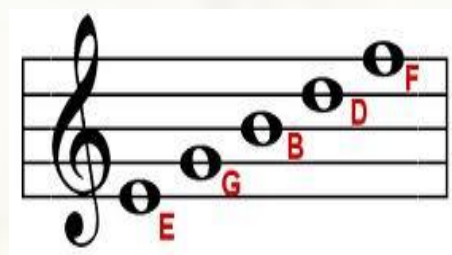
MELODY – tune

ACCOMPANIMENT – music that supports the main tune

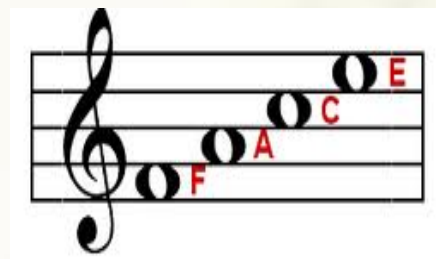
