### Making Choices about diet & Exercise

This is the Health Education lesson for Year 8 pupils, exploring food choices, physical activity, and balanced lifestyles. In this lesson, students explore what influences diet and exercise choices and how to discern between reliable and less reliable health information.



### **Exploring Attitudes**

*Is* the first of four lessons for Year 9, focusing on the risks and consequences of drug use. We asses current understanding of drugs, explore attitudes towards their use and clarify perceptions regarding the prevalence of drug use

**Managing risk,** the second lesson moves on to the risks and consequences of drug use. This lesson will teach students about the law in relation to drugs.

### Alcohol and cannabis

the third lesson explores the effects of different patterns of alcohol use, in addition to the health risks associated with alcohol and cannabis use

### **Managing influences**

is the last of four lessons focusing on the risks and consequences of drug use. This lesson develops skills and strategies to manage pressure in and influence relation to substances.

### **Vaping**

In this lesson pupils explore the consequences of vaping and challenging the influences that might encourage young people to vape.

Individual Liberty 4.Rule of Law Lesson Senuence: Respectful Relationship Behavior's Pupils will be learning about beginning and growing positive relationships to assess readiness for intimacy. They will be able to explain the difference between welcome and unwelcome interest and describe what respectful behaviour looks like in both everyday and romantic contexts. They will now how to explain when and how to access support if encountering inappropriate behaviours. Capacity to Consent Pupils will be learning about what 'freedom' and 'capacity' to consent mean in different contexts. They can then explain what is meant by freedom and capacity to consent. We explore contexts where freedom or capacity to consent have been reduced or removed, and why this means consent has no longer been given. Managing the Ending of Relationships Pupils will be learning how to manage the end of an intimate relationship and how to identify the range of emotions associated with breakups. We look at ways to manage a break-up safely and appropriately and suggest strategies to help manage emotions during a break-Pressure, Persuasion and Coercion Pupils learn how consent sought through pressure and coercion is wrong and is not genuine. We are learn how to manage pressure to consent and how to recognise when asking for consent becomes inappropriately pressurising or persuasive.. We explore the legal consequences of pressure, persuasion and coercion in relation to consent.

### The Impact of Pornography

Pupils learn about pornography and its impact on understanding consent. We evaluate the impact of pornography on people's understanding and expectations of consent. Pupils look at how to challenge inaccurate and dangerous messages about sexuality, gender and consent perpetuated by pornography.

My Values begins with a recap of British values & what living in Britain means. The lesson then moves on to understand what core values are and the importance of having them.

We look at Internal values the things that are important to us that we cannot see, and External values are things that are important to us that we can see. We explore that people are happier when they focus on what they value, rather than being influenced by external things like advertising and social media that tell us we should value looks, status, money and 'things.

Being a positive Bystander To understand what a positive bystander is and why it is important to be one. We look at what action you can take to be a positive bystander & the barrier that might stop you.

### The Cost of living

This fourth lesson within the topic explores the cost of living in the UK and how this is impacting on families across the county. Pupils will have access to IT and will be tasked in vested various costs dependant on where abouts in the UK live.
